

## > FACTS ABOUT CHILD ABUSE

“Over the past decade, the world health community has witnessed an explosion in the knowledge of trauma and its multifaceted impact on the human brain and its psyche

[Bearup 2010].

Recent data on sexual abuse indicates that **1 in 3 girls** and **1 in 5 boys** are assaulted during their childhood. The cost child abuse to our community is overwhelming our service systems, and impacts socially, physically, financially, psychologically and spiritually.

For the survivor, their experience permeates their entire being and the affects are lifelong. Those children grow into adulthood via the legacy of “sacred wounding”, often exhibiting chronic symptoms which dislocates their ability to function, engage in and embrace life. These chronic symptoms include:

- Depression and Anxiety
- Mental illness
- Drug, alcohol and a diverse range of other addictive behaviours
- Suicidal ideation and suicide
- Violence and criminal behaviours
- Distorted sexuality
- Relationship difficulties
- Parenting issues
- Homelessness
- Self-abuse

# 'A Toxic Heirloom'

This 2 hour introductory seminar will explore the generational impact of childhood abuse. It will provide insight, strategies and hope for recovery.

*The seminar is presented in 3 parts:*

### UNDERSTANDING IMPACT

Most of us will have experienced trauma in our childhood that has affected us in some way.

### SELF ALIGNMENT

As a result of this childhood trauma we develop survivor behaviours that create barriers to engaging and embracing life to our full potential.

### REWRITING THE LEGACY

Survivor behaviours, if not identified and managed, will ultimately be passed on to all whom we come in contact, with in one way or another. They become an intergenerational toxic heirloom.

#### Who should attend?

Anyone who has a lived experience of childhood trauma or loves someone who is dealing with the impact. This may include partners, parents, family, friends, carers and significant others of any kind.

Anyone who has an interest in childhood trauma. This may include: support workers, counsellors, social and community service workers, team leaders and managers in the community sector, residential care workers, case managers and mental health practitioners.
